Mission

Ensure all personnel are trained with the skills to maintain resilience, as well as to recognize distress, intervene appropriately, and escort those in need to advanced care.

Ensure investigations on suspected suicides are conducted and reported to higher command.

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Resilience Training

➤ Master Resilience Trainer (MRT)

80-Hour Course instructed by CSF2 qualified trainers. Army Goal of 1 MRT per Company of Soldiers (~1:100)

➤ Resilience Training Assistant (RTA)

25-Hour Course instructed by MRT at the unit level. Army Goal of 1 RTA per platoon of Soldiers (~1:30)

➤ Annual Resilience Training

2-Hours of instruction per module of the resilience program. Recorded in ARMS

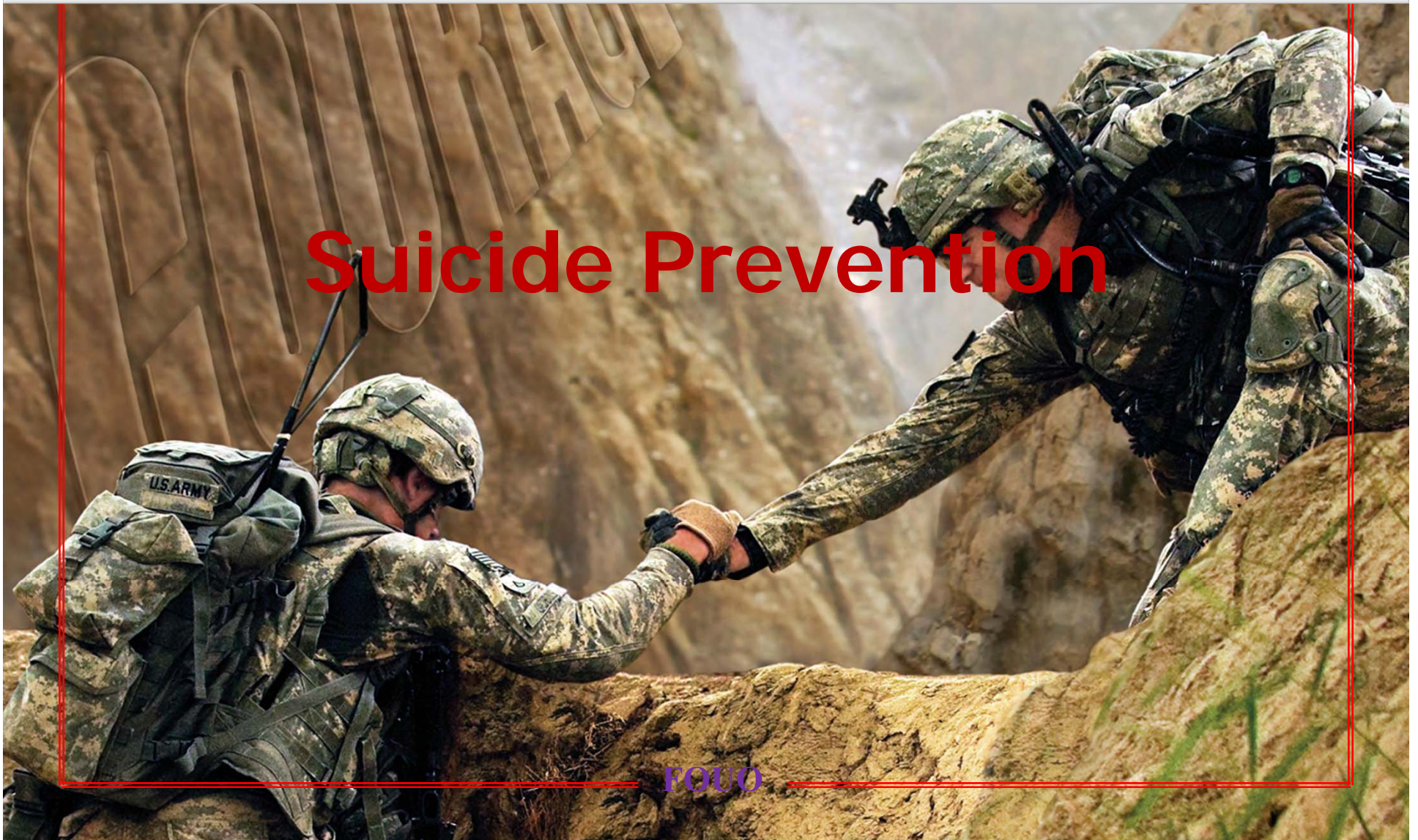
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Suicide Prevention

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Suicide Prevention Training

➤ **Ask Care Escort (ACE)**

Annual requirement for all Soldiers. 1.5 hour class instructed by the Company Suicide Prevention Officer (SPO)

➤ **Ask Care Escort-Suicide Intervention (ACE-SI)**

Required for all first line leaders. 4 hour class instructed by ACE-SI T4T Soldiers. Intervention focused uses scenario based training.

➤ **Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)**

Required for all Gatekeepers. 2 day course instructed by LivingWorks certified personnel. Intervention focused with a detailed suicide intervention model and role playing in an controlled environment.

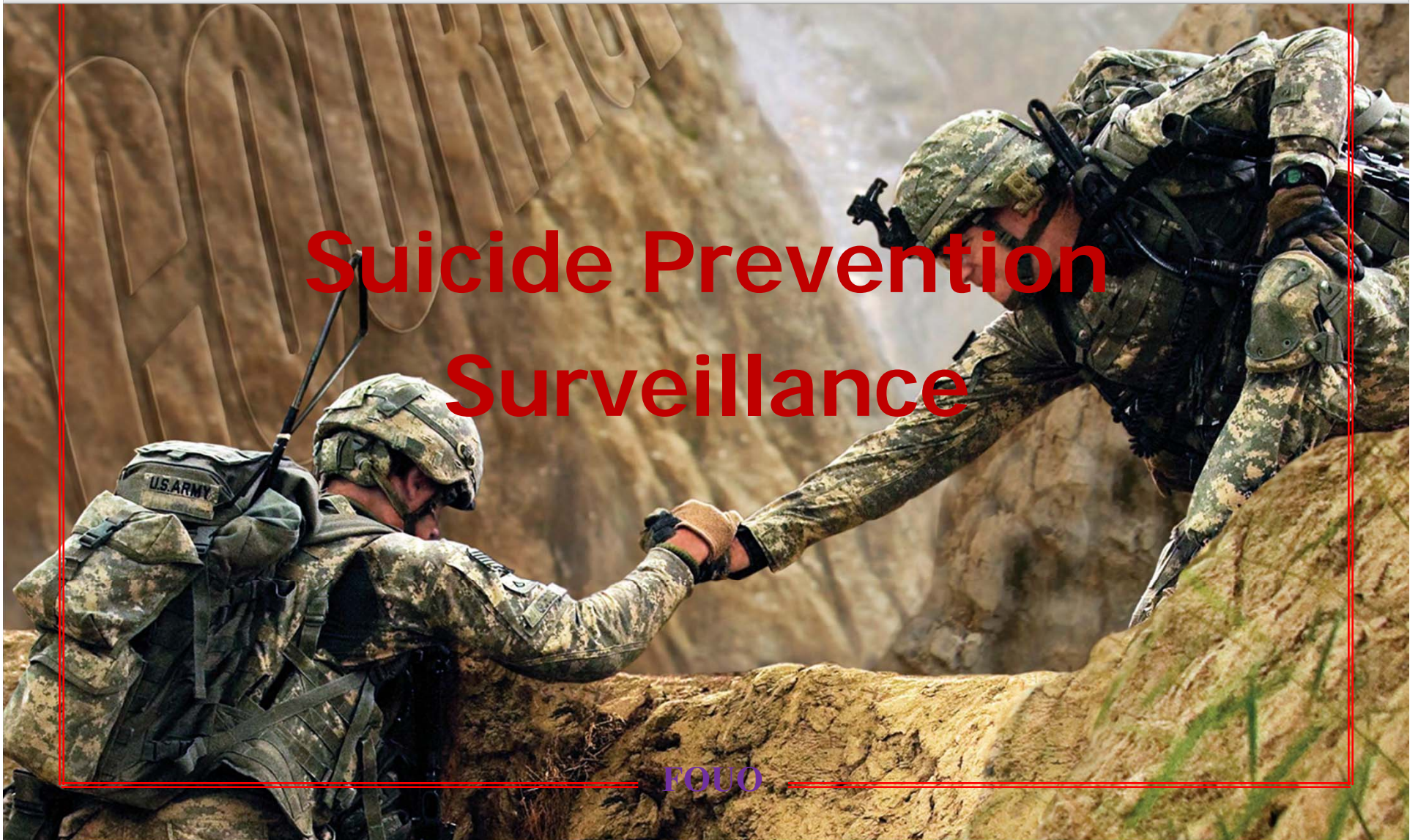
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Suicide Prevention Surveillance

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Suicide Surveillance Overview

➤ Casualties

1. Serious Incident Report (SIR)
2. Initial / Critical Incident Management System (CIMS) Input
3. 15-6 Investigation Initiated
4. CIMS Input

➤ Ideations / Attempts

1. Input into CIMS

➤ Equivocal Deaths

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Casualties

- **SIR originated/updated as necessary**
 1. Within 48 hours of death notification
 2. Updated SIR due for all Equivocal deaths upon resolution

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Casualties

➤ 15-6 Investigation for suicide

Purpose

Identify issues which contribute to Soldier suicides.

Identify Lessons Learned.

Provide recommendations for Soldier Care Solutions and Best Practices

Suicidal 15-6's are not for...

Laying Blame

Making a determination of death

Superseding local civil investigations

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Casualties

➤ 15-6 Investigation for suicide (cont.)

Requirements

For every suicide or equivocal death

TAG is appointing authority – Major or above

Completed within 30 days of Investigating Officer (IO) appointment

Disposition

SPPM input into CIMS

Forward copy of 15-6 Investigation to ARNG-NGB

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Ideations and Attempts

- SIR Received and input into CIMS
- No 15-6 Investigation Required

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Equivocal Deaths

➤ NGB tracks equivocal deaths in CIMS

➤ 15-6 Investigation is required.

➤ **Disposition Options**

Equivocal Death

-

15-6 Investigation is halted

Suicide

-

15-6 Investigation continues
